### The Carder's Chronicles

The discipleship adventure we have been on since 2023 has led us to working with 3 different organizations. New Generations, eLife, and Beautiful Feet. Each has a unique role in ministry and we are excited to be serving alongside some incredible men and women. This year we traveled to Oregon and Chicago for conferences pertaining to Disciple Making Movements (DMM), and spent 3 weeks in Indonesia, on 2 islands with 3 different teams working there.

We had a few notable speaking engagements this past year. Heather had an opportunity for the first time at Women's World to be a breakout presenter. She taught on sharing "your story and God's story". It was a well attended session and she was excited to Teach.

We were also excited to be invited to Victory Village (VV) for their school orientation. VV is a boarding school for adopted kids who are struggling to integrate into their families. The school works really hard not only with education, but also counseling for both the students and families. They asked us to talk to them about what discipleship might look like in their setting and families.

Finally, we celebrated our 25th anniversary this summer, and since we were already in Indonesia we decided to take a few days at the end of our trip to get away and spend time just the two of us. It has been a wild adventure being in ministry for so long, and the time away was really good for us both.
